Business Meeting	Ms. Jarvis called the meeting to order at 10:03 am.
Introduction	Committee member Introductions. Introductions of all Division of Health Service Regulation staff members in attendance.
	Review of Executive Order No. 46 and Executive Order No. 331.
Business Meeting – 2026 SMFP	TR made a motion seconded by VE to approve the minutes from the April 10, 2025 meeting; the vote carried unopposed with no discussion.
Chapter 10 – Nursing Care	Ms. J recognized Amy Craddock, Planner.
Facilities	AC reviewed the data tables and proposed need determinations for C10.
	Decrease of 212 beds from previous year
	 Projected utilization for 2029 is 18% higher than 2028
	Draft determination for 40 beds in Davie County
	Ms. J opened the floor for discussion.
	TR questioned what was driving the reduction in beds.
	AC: 139 beds closed in Wake County without relocation, other decreases are "drips and drabs" of closures in other locations. We don't necessarily know why but its often things like changing a semi-private room to private room.
	TR: When given a CON for beds, at any point they can request a reduction of licensed beds and therefore reduce the availability of beds?
	AC responded that this is generally the case. Wasn't sure the specifics on the reasoning or specific processes and notes that reduction in beds goes through Licensure and not CON.
	TR: If SHCC has determined a need for beds for a given population, curious how reduction of bed availability addressed.

	VJ similarly questions if need for replacement is accounted for after reduction/closure of beds.
	AC responds that bed closures are only replaced if it triggers a need in the area based on the SMFP
	methodology. In this case Wake County still had no need generated after the closure of 139 beds.

	The number of deaths in the state did increase this year. There is a need determination for a total of 8 hospice offices. One each in Burke, Cleveland,
	Guildford, Haywood, Johnston, McDowell, Randolph, and Rockingham Counties.
	The data at this time is preliminary and subject to ongoing revisions.
	Ms. J opened the floor for discussion.
	TR notes this is the most need he's seen in 28 years. Points out increased utilization of end-of-life services.
	Transics this is the most need he s seen in 20 years. Folints out increased utilization of end-of-life services.
	JM agrees by far the most need seen in his years of SHCC. Question if this is the final effect of Covid or some other driver.
	EB also thought it was unusual, wasn't expecting 8 office need. Believes it to be multifactorial; contributing factors increasing death, increase population, increase of hospice deaths, projected deaths served now around 50%.
	SG agrees its unusual, other committees such as acute care are seeing unprecedent bed needs. Wonders if its fallout from several years of COVID.

	TR commented on the elimination of CON. Stated that the State Senate put it in budget to remove CON. Shared that his latest information shows that State House does not have removal of CON in its budget. Coalition of hospice, home health, radiologists, and other groups have been "working" Senate and House to keep CON. TR and SG hope we don't lose CON in NC and mimic issues other states having.
